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Santa Clara Caltrain Transit Center Service Improvement Project

Overview

The Santa Clara Caltrain Transit Center and Parking Expansion Project is one of a series of Caltrain Service Improvement Projects designed to ease transfers between VTA and Caltrain and improve the efficiency of Caltrain service in Santa Clara County.

Project Features

- New and rebuilt bus bays to accommodate the larger articulated buses now in use on VTA's Line 22
- A new passenger shelter adjacent to the new loading platform
- Relocated bus stops for multiple VTA Bus lines, including VTA's Airport Flyer, closer to the Caltrain platforms
- Parking lot improvements, including 45 new parking spaces, a new parking ticket vending machine and new security lighting
- Roadway improvements to better accommodate articulated buses
- New sidewalks and improvements to existing sidewalks.

Disabled Access

The expanded transit center and parking lot are fully accessible in compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) and California Title 24.

Operations

Articulated buses now have a dedicated bus stop on Railroad Avenue across from the Santa Clara Caltrain Station for improved passenger service.

VTA's Airport Flyer (Route 10) now uses a bus stop closer to the Caltrain platform.

Capital Cost

Total project budget: \$5.2 million (including property acquisition, design and construction) from 1996 Measure B local sales tax revenue.

Project Schedule

Construction Started: January 26, 2003

Construction Completion: October 10, 2003
