


#### Why Are We Here Today?

VTA is considering a new Transit-Oriented Development (TOD) at the Gilroy Transit Center on Monterey between 7<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> Street

- Connects to Downtown and will influence Downtown's future
- Current key transportation hub, future site of High Speed Rail
- Will be a mix of uses (retail, workforce housing, community benefits, etc.)
- Phase 1 will be built by a high-quality non-profit developer to be selected and overseen by VTA and the County



#### Bus

- 85,000 Weekday Boardings
- 67 Routes
- Newest buses are all electric



#### **Light Rail**

- 27,000 Weekday Boardings
- 3 lines
- 61 Stations
- 99 vehicles

#### **Paratransit service**

- provided to eligible individuals who cannot use conventional services

- 25 properties throughout Santa Clara County
- Program Goals
  - Develop projects that support transit ridership
  - Attract private investment in surrounding communities (Downtown Gilroy)
  - Generate revenue for transit operations


#### **Community Engagement is Important**

- An ongoing conversation that allows the community to help define and shape the city's future





#### **VTA's Affordable Housing Policy**



- On all VTA TOD sites with housing, at least 20% of units must be affordable to households earning 60% or less of Area Median Income
- Overall we will plan for at least 35% of housing on our lands to be affordable
- VTA has partnered with Santa Clara County's Office of Supportive Housing to help fund housing for people who live or work in Gilroy



### **Housing Needs in Gilroy**



A family of four with two working adults (teacher and bank teller) earning \$117,000 per year are eligible for affordable housing (75% AMI).



- Gilroy needs housing that all residents can afford, including residents who are unhoused, at risk of losing their housing, and working people struggling to pay for housing
- Over 1,600 low-income households in Gilroy pay more than half of their income for housing
- In Gilroy, a site like this could accommodate families of 4 earning between \$47,000 and \$126,000
- For example, rents could range from \$1,050 to \$2,800 for a two-bedroom apartment.




Context Map: VTA Property


