



### **Potential Addition of CWG Members**

### JULIAN PAVEMENT MAINTENANCE

- Scope: Pavement Maintenance from 6th to 28th; Buffered Bike Lanes from 21st to 28th (striping + signs)
- Funding: Pavement Maintenance Program
- Timeline: Construction Summer/Fall 2023



## JULIAN/MCKEE PROTECTED BIKE LANES

• Scope:

- 21st to 28th: enhance new bike lanes by adding concrete islands for physical separation from vehicle lanes
- King to White: upgrade existing Class II to Class IV bike lanes with physical separation
- Funding: \$841,000 (Total) \$705,000 (Quickstrike Grant) \$136,000 (Local Match)
- Timeline: October 2023 Jan 2024



# 26TH & JULIAN

- **Purpose:** Improve safety for pedestrians crossing Julian in this area
  - Scope: Add Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacon (RRFB) and pedestrian refuge island to high visibility crosswalk at 26th
- Timeline: Summer/Fall 2023

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### MCKEE RD IMPROVEMENTS

• Limits: 33rd Street to Toyon Ave

#### • Scope:

- Repaving from 101 to King Rd
- High Visibility crosswalks
- ADA compliant curb ramps
- Radar speed feedback signs
- Raised median islands and pedestrian median fencing
- Modified right-turn slip-lanes or reduced corner radii at King, Checkers, Jose Figueres, Jackson, 680 ramps, Capitol Ave
- Traffic signal improvements at 101 E Ramp, 33rd, Checkers, El Rancho Verde, Jose Figueres, White
- Funding:


\$10,980,000 (Total) \$8,623,000 (Grant) OBAG 2 \$2,357,000 (Local Match)

• Timeline: April 2023 – December 2023



28TH & JULIAN

- **Purpose**: Improve pedestrian and bicycle access through this intersection, especially as an access route to the BART station, and with future development
- Funding: TBD (combination of Development, VTA, City, and Grants)
- **Timeline**: Target completion by the time of BSVII opening ~2030
- Notes: Caltrans coordination required

## MCKEE/101 PED OVERCROSSING

- "San José BART Station Access Planning: Final Report April 2016" recommended:
  - "...investigate the advantages and disadvantages of a potential pedestrian/bike bridge over US-101 between the future BART station and E Saint James Street." (p.4-15)
- City staff currently exploring feasibility of a ped overcrossing over US-101 and will weave it into the Five Wounds Urban Village Update process


### **Contractor Innovation – Initiated Design Change**


### **Reduce construction-related impacts to surrounding**

- Construct platform within tunnel, instead of via cut-and-cover
- Limit excavation to station entrance shaft
- Reduce overall haul volume
- Reduce construction duration and disruption

### **Circular station entrance shaft**

- Offers consistent passenger experience for all underground stations on BSVII Extension
- Accommodates feedback from 2021's Station Look & Feel effort







## Framing Concepts Unchanged

- Efficient routes to & from trains
- Similar and larger opportunities for art
- Incorporate traditional Portuguese design treatments
- Complement the Five Wounds Portuguese National Parish
- Fit with aesthetic of the neighborhood

This includes exploration of accommodations for future project elements.




- Larger diameter circular shaft
- Reduces number of escalator switchbacks
- Simplifies path to and from platform
- Emphasis on unique passenger experience
- Facilitates placemaking via potential for rooftop garden above station






- Extend underground mezzanine to enable future connection from south side
- Install "knock-out panels" within tunnel lining to facilitate future connection




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### Further Refined Diridon Station Concept

#### **Station Design Refinements**

- Consolidates back-of-house (BOH) facilities
- TOD fronting Post Street no longer subject to stringent BART design standards
- Greatly reduced cost to construct development on this site

### **Diridon Station Area Planned Developments**





Over 4,000,000 sq. ft. of office and mixed-use new development are planned immediately adjacent to the Diridon BART Station.



### **Diridon BART Station Refinements**

#### Allow for future connection to DISC

- West vent and emergency egress facility design to enable phased expansion into passenger entrance
- Future connection would require:
  - Extension of mezzanine beyond west end of platform
  - Puncture of tunnel lining once exact location is determined
  - Ongoing coordination to ensure BART operations could continue during construction






