

# FACT SHEET: Highways

## US 101-De La Cruz Boulevard/Trimble Road Interchange Improvements

#### Overview

The Santa Clara Valley Transportation Authority (VTA), in cooperation with the City of San Jose and the California Department of Transportation (Caltrans), proposes to improve the De La Cruz Boulevard-Trimble Road interchange on U.S. Highway 1 01 (US 1 01) in the City of San Jose.

#### **Objectives**

The purpose of this project is to improve traffic and enhance safety for vehicles merging onto southbound US 101 from the De La Cruz Boulevard-Trimble Road interchange in the City of San Jose and improve mobility and enhance safety for bicyclists and pedestrians travelling across the interchange.

#### **Project Features**

The proposed improvements include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Replacing the existing US 101 overcrossing to provide additional lanes and accommodating bike and pedestrian facilities;
- Widening De La Cruz Blvd/Trimble Road to six travel lanes through the interchange limits;
- Reconstructing the southbound exit loop to a partial cloverleaf design and incorporating a new intersection on De La Cruz Boulevard;
- Configuring interchange and surface street improvements for multi-modal uses, including pedestrian and bicycle users;
- Reconstructing the intersection of De La Cruz Boulevard and Central Expressway to provide bike lanes, and additional through and turning lanes.

#### Capital Cost/Project Funding

The preliminary project cost is estimated to be \$70 million and \$75 million, contingent on the final determination of improvements. The project is to be funded by a combination of VTA 2016 Measure B funds, local funds, and potential SB1 funds.


