US 101/SR 152/10th Street Interchange Improvement Project

Project Description

The Santa Clara Valley Transportation Authority (VTA), in cooperation with the City of Gilroy and the California Department of Transportation (Caltrans), proposes to modify the US 101/SR 152/10th Street Interchange in the City of Gilroy.


Objectives

The purpose of this project is to improve traffic operations and facilities for multimodal forms of transportation including bicycle, pedestrian and high occupancy vehicle uses at the US 101/SR 152/10th Street Interchange and along 10th Street.

Project Features

The proposed improvements include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Widen the existing bridge from two lanes to three traffic lanes
- Widen 10th Street to accommodate a new traffic lane in each direction
- Modify existing on-ramps and off-ramps as required; and
- Modify existing local street intersections and upgrade bicycle and pedestrian facilities along 10th Street.



Capital Cost/Project Funding

The project cost is estimated to be between \$50 million and \$60 million, contingent on the final determination of improvements that are yet to be determined. The project is proposed to be funded by a combination of VTA 2016 Measure B and local funds.

Project Schedule

Alternatives Analysis and Preliminary Engineering (PID)	January 2022 – December 2023
Environmental Approval*	January 2024 – December 2025
Design Completion*	January 2026 – June 2028
Project Construction*	July 2028 – March 2030

* Full funding for this phase of the project has not yet been identified.
