




VTA's Role in Santa Clara County

VTA is more than buses and light rail. As the County Transportation Agency, we also:

- Act as a funding conduit for local cities and other agencies
- Design and build transit facilities, highway improvements, and expand rail service
- Plan for congestion management and landuse
- Design, build and own BART to Silicon Valley infrastructure in Santa Clara County

VTA Bicycle & Pedestrian Program Role


- VTA's plans support local bicycle, pedestrian, trail plans

 - Delivers selected education encouragement programs





Key Map






Education Encouragement

- Bicycle education classes
- Countywide bikeway map
- Traffic safety campaign









Transit/Bike/Ped Integration

- Wheels on the Bus Real Time Data
 - \$500,000 SMART Grant
 - Collect & disseminate real-time use data for bike racks & wheelchair securement area
- Electronic Lockers
 - \$2 M Safe & Seamless Grant
 - Upgrade & replace VTA locker fleet
 - Move from rental to on-demand
