

Featured Program:

Transit Operations Improve Amenities Subcategory

The goals of the Transit Operations Program category are to increase ridership, improve efficiency, enhance mobility services for seniors and individuals with disabilities, and improve affordability for the underserved and vulnerable populations in the County. The Improve Amenities subcategory provides funds to improve amenities at VTA bus stops to increase safety, security and access, as well as on-going maintenance.

VTA's Better Bus Stops program is in its fifth year, starting in 2020 with steady funding from 2016 Measure B and supplemental MTC grant funding. The program focuses on installing brandnew VTA amenities throughout the County.

Amenities are installed based on ridership, per VTA's Transit Passenger Environment Plan, the guiding document for the Better Bus Stops program.
