Overview

One Bay Area Grant Cycle 4 (OBAG 4) is a four-year program that will distribute \$81 million in federal funds to transportation projects in Santa Clara County.

As the County Transportation Agency for Santa Clara County, the Santa Clara Valley Transportation Authority (VTA) is responsible for local project solicitation, evaluation, and nomination.

What the Money Can Fund

A variety of improvements are eligible for funding, including but not limited to:

Safety & Infrastructure Improvements

- Complete Streets
- Safe Routes to School
- Street repaving
- Safer & wider sidewalks
- Streetlights & walk buttons on traffic signals
- Bike detectors at traffic signals
- Bus stop shelters & amenities
- Timed traffic signal



Better Trips & Pathways

- New sidewalks & crosswalks
- New bicycle paths & multi-use trails
- Safer bike lanes
- Bus boarding islands & bus-only lanes
- New bike/pedestrian bridges & tunnels



Transportation projects funded by OBAG 4 must be consistent with the **Metropolitan Transportation Commission's Complete Streets Policy and Transit Priority Policy for Roadways.**
