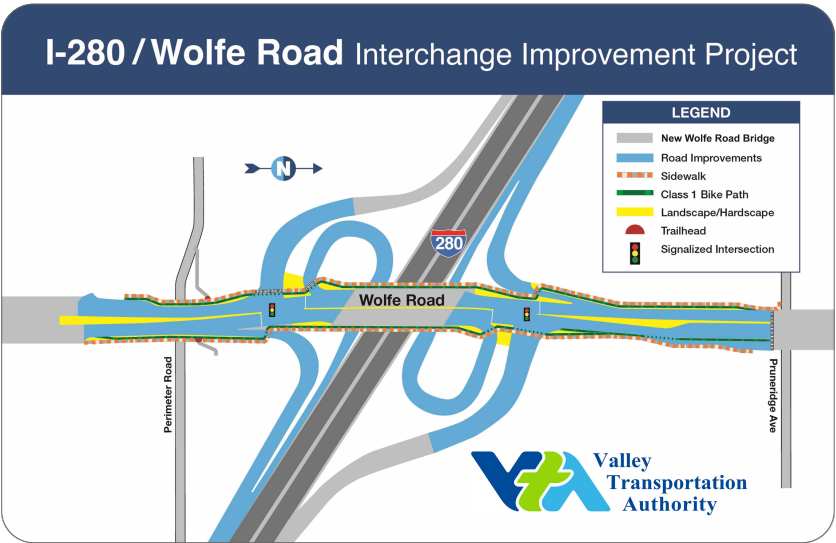
I-280/Wolfe Road Interchange Improvement Project

Overview

The Santa Clara Valley Transportation Authority (VTA), in partnership with the City of Cupertino and the California Department of Transportation (Caltrans), is improving the I-280/Wolfe Road interchange in the City of Cupertino. The project will reconstruct the interchange to enhance bicycle and pedestrian safety and connectivity, while also improving traffic operations for all users.

Objectives

The primary goal of this project is to create a safer, more accessible, and more comfortable crossing of I-280 for people walking and biking, while supporting efficient vehicle operations.



Project Features

Major improvements include:

- Upgraded bicycle and pedestrian facilities along Wolfe Road, including safer crossings and improved connectivity through the interchange area.
- Reconstruction of the Wolfe Road overcrossing with a wider structure, prioritizing bicycle and pedestrian travel with wider sidewalks.
- Construction of new on-ramps and off-ramps to improve interchange operations.
- Retaining walls and sound walls, as needed, to support roadway and multimodal improvements and minimize community impacts.

Capital Cost/Project Funding

The total project cost is estimated at \$115 million to \$124 million. Funding is provided by VTA 2016 Measure B, local funds, and State funding sources.
